Sin

What is sin?

The law was added so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more, so that just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. – Romans 5: 20-21

This verse introduces two forces that are at work in our lives. They are _____ and God's _____.

What is the office of the keys?

“Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.” John 20:22-23

Who are repentant sinners?

The office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins (announce absolution) of repentant sinners but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent (confession).

Repentant sinners are those who are sorry for their sins (_____) and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior (_____).

The Office of the Keys is a special God-given way of applying the Gospel (forgiveness of sins), through His Church, to you in four ways.

2. Baptism
3. Holy Communion
4. Confession and absolution

THE KEYS

First: *What is the use of the Keys?*

The use of the Keys is that special power and right which Christ gave to his church on earth: to forgive the sins of penitent sinners but refuse forgiveness to the impenitent as long as they do not repent.

Where is this written?

The holy evangelist John writes in chapter 20, "[Jesus] breathed on [his disciples] and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.'"
