Topic: God Created the World

Lesson: Genesis 1-2

There is much confusion surrounding the origin of the universe. Many believe one of the numerous theories of evolution. Others try to give God a part in these theories by teaching a theory called theistic evolution. Still others believe that God created the world.

The Bible clearly states that God created the world. It says this, not just in the first two chapters of Genesis, but over 70 times throughout the Old and New Testaments. Jesus, during his ministry, also put his stamp of approval on the biblical account of creation.

Read Genesis 1:1

In this verse we notice something about God right away. He existed **before** creation. Read:

Psalm 90:2 **Before** the mountains were born or you brought forth the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

Although we mainly focus on the Father creating, Scripture actually says all three persons of the Trinity were involved.

Look at the highlighted portion of each verse and answer which person of our God it is talking about:

1 Corinthians 8:6 ⁶yet for us there is but one God, **the Father, from whom all things came**, and for whom we live; and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came and through whom we live.

Colossians 1:16 ¹⁶For **by him** (use the section header to find out who the "him" is) **all things were created:** things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him.

Psalm 104:30 ³⁰When you send **your Spirit, they are created**, and you renew the face of the earth.

What Did God Use to Create Everything?

God created "the heavens and the earth" (*i.e., the universe*) out of nothing.

Hebrews 11:3 ³By _____ we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was _____.

Throughout Genesis one we also see God's great _____ in creation. "Omniscience" comes into play here.

How does his creation of light on the first day reveal that he is all-wise and or all knowing (omniscient)?



This verse shows that God created everything "**ex nihilo**" out of nothing. There was nothing before God started creating.

How Long Did It Take? Millions of Years?

Each day of creation is described in the same way. "And there was evening, and there was morning - the first (... second, ... third etc.) day."

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son or daughter, nor your male or female servant, nor your animals, nor any foreigner residing in your towns.¹¹ For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

The Bible clearly states, again and again, that God took only six 24 hour days to create everything.

WHAT ABOUT THE BIG BANG?



The “big bang” is a story about how the universe came into existence. It proposes that billions of years ago the universe began in a tiny, infinitely hot and dense point. This point supposedly contained not only all the mass and energy that would become everything we see

today. It is supposed that over vast periods of time, the energy from the big bang cooled down as the universe expanded. Some of it turned into matter—hydrogen and helium gas. These gases collapsed to form stars and galaxies of stars. Some of the stars created the heavier elements in their core and then exploded, distributing these elements into space. Some of the heavier elements allegedly began to stick together and formed the earth and other planets.

This story of origins is entirely fiction. But sadly, many people claim to believe the big-bang model. If you want to read of the science involved please read <https://answersingenesis.org/big-bang/does-the-big-bang-fit-with-the-bible/>.

Fast Facts

- Ironically, the one thing the big bang does not explain is the origin of the universe. It is only a story about what supposedly happened afterwards. Where did the first matter come from?
 - Claims that God used natural processes deny what the Creator Himself has said about the creation process.
1. The Bible tells us that God created heaven, earth, and everything within them in the span of six days ([Exodus 20:11](#)) and rested on the seventh day. This is the basis for our work week ([Exodus 20:8](#)). In contrast, the big bang model claims that the universe and earth formed over billions of years.
 2. Genesis tells us that God created the stars on the fourth day—three days after the earth was created. In contrast, the big bang model claims that stars existed billions of years before the earth.
 3. The Bible tells us that the earth was made from water ([2 Peter 3:5](#); [Genesis 1:2-9](#); [Psalm 24:2](#)), but the standard secular model teaches that the earth began as a molten blob.

In short, the Holy Bible, God’s eye witness report contradicts the Big Bang theory.
