



# The First Article of the Apostle's Creed

## Topic: The Fall into Sin

### Lesson: GENESIS 3:1-19

#### Read Genesis 3:1-5

If God was going to forbid Adam and Eve from eating of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, why did he create it in the first place? (see John 14:23 for help)

•Put an asterisks next to verses 4 and 5 and in the margin write, "See John 8:44." What does that passage tell us about the way that the devil tries to get us to fall away from God?



You know from Sunday School that the devil was using the form of the snake to tempt Adam and Eve. But did you know the Bible tells us that it was satan? Use your concordance in the back of your Bible to find the New Testament passage that tells us it was the devil in the snake's skin.

#### Where did the devil come from?

Read Colossians 1:16.

*For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him.*

Where did the angels come from?

Now check out Job 38:4-7.

*"Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand. Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! Who stretched a measuring line across it? On what were its footings set, or who laid its cornerstone- while the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy?"*

Did it appear that God created the angels early or late in the creation process?

#### How many angels did God create?

Read Hebrews 12:22 and Daniel 7:10.

*But you have come to Mount Zion, to the heavenly Jerusalem, the city of the living God. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly,*

*<sup>10</sup> A river of fire was flowing, coming out from before him. Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated, and the books were opened.*

Mathematicians, how many angels did Daniel say God made? What did he mean?

Read Luke 20:35-36.

*But those who are considered worthy of taking part in that age and in the resurrection from the dead will neither marry nor be given in marriage, and they can no longer die; for they are like the angels. They are God's children, since they are children of the resurrection.*

What do we learn about the number of angels?

## Where do demons come from?

Read

Genesis 1:31. *God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.*

And

2 Peter 2:4 *For if God did not spare angels when they sinned, but sent them to hell, putting them in chains of darkness to be held for judgment;*

How do we know demons were once good angels that fell?

When did the fall of the evil angels take place?  
How do we know?  
*(For further study, read Ezekiel 28:12-19 and Isaiah 14:12-15.)*

## How powerful are these fallen angels?

Read Mark 5:9 (and context)

<sup>9</sup> *Then Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" "My name is Legion," he replied, "for we are many."<sup>10</sup> And he begged Jesus again and again not to send them out of the area.*

How many evil angels are there?

What power do they display in this verse (and context)?

What are some signs of demon possession?

Read

Matthew 24:24 *For false Christs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and miracles to deceive even the elect—if that were possible.*

Acts 19:16. *Then the man who had the evil spirit jumped on them and overpowered them all. He gave them such a beating that they ran out of the house naked and bleeding.*

What powers do they display here?

## What else do we know of them?

Look at the following verses and summarize what we know of the angels:

Ephesians 6:12 –

1 Timothy 4:1-2 –

Matthew 12:24-26 –

2 Thessalonians 2:9-10 –

•How do the devil's lies in Genesis 4 and 5 call God's truthfulness into question?

How do those lies call God's love into question?

## Read Genesis 3:6-13

In what 3 ways did the fruit appeal to Eve (v6)?

What would happen between the serpent and the seed of the woman (v15)? Explain how this came true and explain the significance.

## Read Genesis 3:14-19

•What was God's punishment upon the serpent?

Describe the punishments the woman received as a result of her sin.

•Since the serpent never ate the forbidden fruit, why did God punish him?

Describe the punishments the man would receive. What else was cursed besides the man, the woman, and the serpent — v17?

•What are the punishments that Eve received?

Among all the cursing and punishments, there is one ray of hope and promise. What is it?

•What are the punishments that Adam received?

Who is God talking about here?

•Do we see people still suffering from these punishments in the world today?

Before a sporting event opponents often boast how they're sure to win. How would you describe God's statement here?

What did Adam say when God asked him about his sin, and what did the woman say when God asked her? (Think: What lessons can we learn from this about blame shifting?)

Read Ephesians 6:11-17.

*<sup>11</sup> Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. <sup>12</sup> For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. <sup>13</sup> Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to*

*stand. <sup>14</sup> Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, <sup>15</sup> and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. <sup>16</sup> In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. <sup>17</sup> Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.*

As scary and as powerful as the devil and demons are, why don't we have to fear them?
